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# From the CIO's Desk

## Stock Market Has Undergone its Longest Corrective Streak: Are the Tables Set To Turn?

### Dear Investor,

Pakistan's stock market, after declining around 6% in October, advanced slightly during the month of November, whereby the KMI-30 index closed up 1.19% at 68,096 pts while the KSE-100 index rose 0.99% to 40,010 pts. Activity at the bourse remained lackluster with average daily volume hovering near five year low. A three week long sit-in by a minority religious party in the country's capital dampened the investor sentiment and ultimately led to resignation of the federal law minister.

Moreover, the index's main board remained under pressure owing to surprise removal of ENGRO from MSCI Emerging Market Standard Index on account of rebalancing announced on November 15, 2017. Pursuant to the downgrade of ENGRO to MSCI Emerging Market Small-Cap Index, heavy selling in the scrip was witnessed from foreign passive funds, leading to a FIPI outflow to the tune of USD 51.9mn during the month. Furthermore, government's decision to shut down Furnace Oil based power plants kept Oil Marketing Companies and Refineries under pressure.

On the economic front, a positive development was witnessed with the successful issuance of a EuroBond and a Sukuk in the International market that cumulatively raised USD 2.5bn for the country. The issuance shall provide some cushion to the deteriorating current account position and undermine the case of a rapid PKR devaluation alongside highlighting the fact that Pakistan is being considered as a strong investment case by the International investors (the sovereign debt issues of the country are still oversubscribed thereby highlighting the investors' confidence).

The index has fallen about 25% from its peak level attained during May 2017. However, it is important to point out that the ongoing correction in the stock market has entered its seventh month and it is safe to say that this corrective streak is the longest in around two decades. Therefore, it is expected that the corrective phase shall now end and the market shall rebound from hereon.

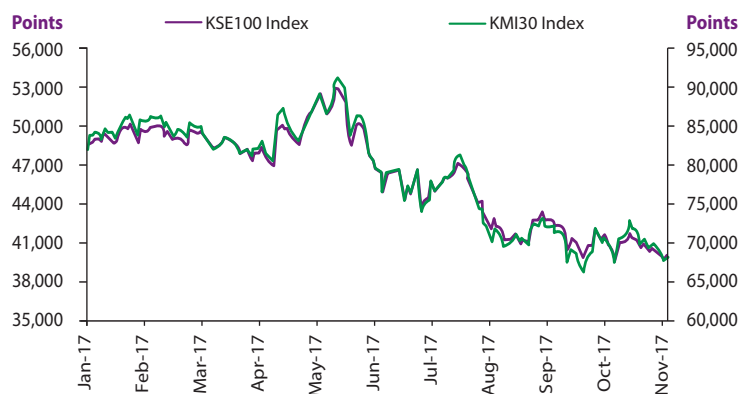
### Outlook

The correction has reinforced the investment case for Pakistan, as the market has become more attractive than ever in terms of its valuations compared to regional peers. With the P/E multiple dropping from over 12x to below 8x coupled with dividend yield enhancing from 3.5% to over 6% during this phase, we are of the view that now is the right time for investors seeking an appropriate entry point in the market.

Some of the first round CPEC projects have already come online and the rest are expected to surface by the end of 2018. Moreover, the government's efforts to substitute furnace oil for RLNG shall further ease pressure on our Current Account going forward. These developments along with strong GDP growth and enhanced corporate profitability expectations shall set the direction of the market once the political noise subsides. In light of the aforementioned positive indicators, we reiterate our bullish view and would advise investors to remain optimistic as market fundamentals remain intact.

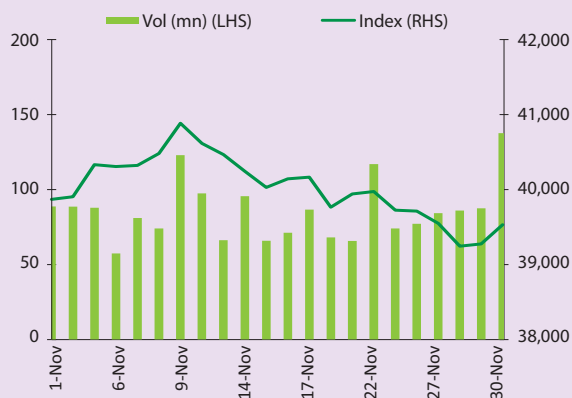
## Stock Market Review

During the month of November 2017, the KSE-100 index was marginally up by 0.99% to close at 40,010 points. Exploration & Production and Banks were major positive contributors to the index. The average daily volume of the market was 62.9 mn shares, down by 14.2% on a MoM basis.

Foreigners reported a net sell of USD 51.9mn in November, while Insurance Companies and Corporates were major buyers with reported figure of USD 19.8mn and USD 18.3mn respectively. Heavy outflows during the month were marked by reduction in weightage of Pakistan in the MSCI EM Indices as a result of ENGRO being excluded on basis of minimum market capitalization. Situation on the political front continued to deteriorate as the government remained under heavy pressure due to proceedings in the accountability courts as well as growing backlash against the Elections Bill 2017 recently passed by the ruling party. Oil prices were higher by 3.24% at the end of the month with Brent closing at USD 62.63/barrel. Higher oil price MoM supported buying in the Oil and Gas Exploration space which assisted the index in posting the marginal gain.

We reiterate our previously communicated stance, and urge investors to look at current levels as an opportunity.

## Money Market Review

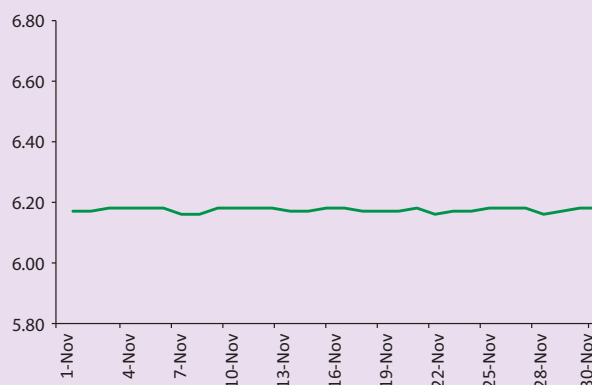
The money market faced a relatively tight liquidity scenario evidenced by Rs. 6.252 trillion worth of OMO injections carried out by the SBP coupled with Rs. 38 billion worth of discounting availed by various counters during this month. The 3MK and 6MK both closed 2bps up at 6.16% and 6.19% respectively. The T-bill yields remained flat while PIB yields declined by 1-7 bps during this period.

Inflation for the month of November 2017 clocked in at 3.97% as compared to 3.80% in October 2017; however, the 5MFY18 average CPI clocked in at 3.59% vs 3.92% in the same period last year.

Moreover, two T-bill auctions were conducted during this period whereby in total Rs. 1.3 trillion was accepted against the participation of Rs. 1.9 trillion with major participation and acceptance in 3 months category (in line with the monetary tightening anticipation in the secondary market). A PIB auction was also conducted in which total participation remained thin at Rs. 24.5 bn against a target of Rs. 50 bn with major participation in 3 year category. However, no bid was accepted by SBP in this PIB auction.

On the forex front, the rupee in interbank market closed Rs. 0.14 weaker at Rs. 105.51/\$ while in the open market, it closed unchanged at Rs. 107.60/\$ during the month.

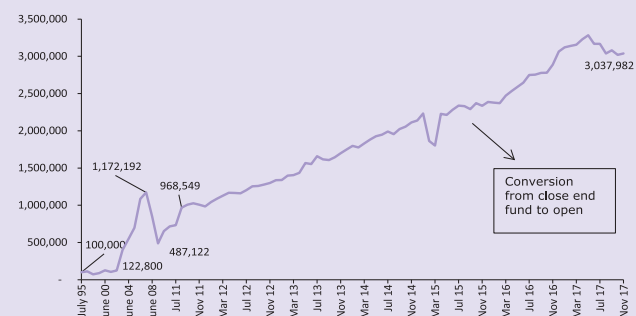

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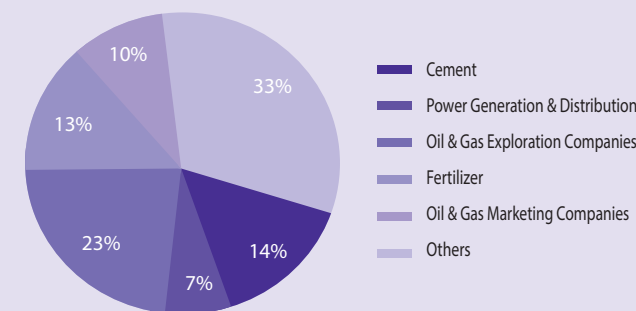
## Investment Growth from FY 1996 - to Date

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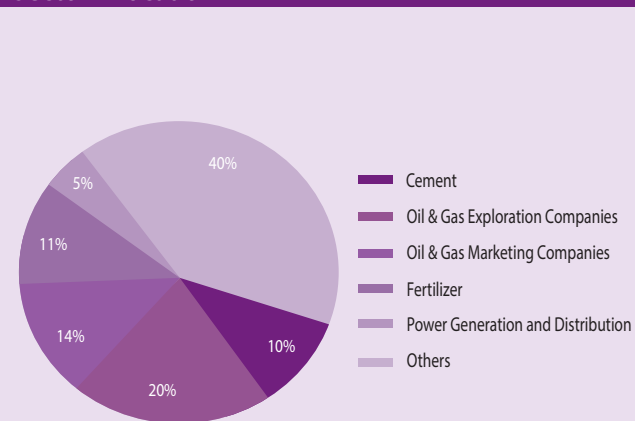
### Fund's Performance

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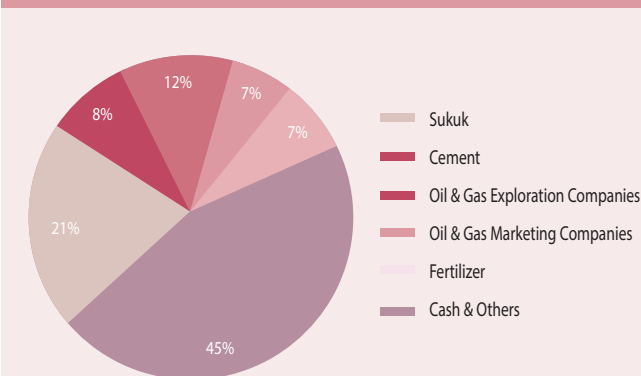
